Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Unveiled and garlanded the statue of Uthamar Gandhi Adigal on 15.08.2022 at Egmore Museum Campus Chennai.

Following this, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu inaugurated the photo exhibition "Viduthalai Poril Thamizhagam" at the Egmore Museum Campus, Chennai on the occasion of Independence Day.

# **COMPLETED WORKS**

size Α full bronze statue of Muthamizharignar Kalaignar was installed at a cost of Rupees One Crore and 70 Lakh at Multi Speciality Hospital, Omandurar Government Estate Campus, Chennai and it was unveiled by the former Vice President of India Thiru.M.Venkaiah Naidu on 28.05.2022.

A full size bronze statue of Annal Ambedkar was installed at Ambedkar Memorial at Raja Annamalaipuram, Chennai and it was unveiled by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 27.10.2022.

For the students and public to benefit by viewing the photographs and learning about literarv works of the acclaimed writer Ki. Rajanarayanan who popularized the 'Karisal' literature to the world, his statue was installed and a library with a memorial was constructed in Kovilpatti at a cost of Rupees One Crore 50 Lakh and 70 Thousand and was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 02.12.2022.

To commemorate the birth centenary of Mahakavi Bharathiyar, the House where he lived while in Varanasi (Kashi), Uttar Pradesh, was announced as a memorial by the Government of Tamil Nadu, and was renovated at a cost of Rupees 18 Lakh and a bust size statue of Bharathiyar was installed there. The renovated memorial and statue were inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu through video conferencing on 11.12.2022. In this function, as the Minister of this department, myself and Secretary to the Government, Government officials participated in-person. A memorial with a full-size statue and a dome at a cost of Rupees 26 Lakh and 30 Thousand for Allala Ilaya Nayagar at Jedarpalayam, Namakkal District was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister for Youth Welfare and Sports Development Thiru. Udhayanidhi Stalin and was opened for public view on 28.01.2023. Hon'ble Ministers and Higher Officials also participated in this function.

honour the sacrifice and mark the Τo completion of 100 years of the death of 16 Piramalai Kallar Martyrs who lost their lives as they were fired by the British as they fought against the British law imposed against them in Memorial 1920. а was constructed at Perungamanallur, Usilampatti Taluk, Madurai District at a cost of Rupees One Crore and 47 Lakh and was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 14.02.2023.

## ANNOUNCEMENTS MADE BY THE HON'BLE CHIEF MINISTER OF TAMIL NADU UNDER RULE 110 IN THE YEAR 2021-22 and 2022-23 - WORKS IN PROGRESS

- In honouring of the great work done by Muthamizharignar Kalaignar and to highlight his achievements and thoughts to the people and future generations, an announcement was build made to а memorial for Muthamizharignar Kalaignar with modern illustrations on 2.21 acres, at a cost of Rs.39 crore, at Anna Memorial premises, Kamarajar Salai, Chennai. Following that, the construction works of the memorial is in progress.
- Rupees 2 Crore 48 Lakh and 75 Thousand has been accorded for setting up of Manimandapam with statue for Ayothidasa Pandithar at Chennai in memory of his 175<sup>th</sup> birth anniversary. The construction works are nearing completion.
- Orders have been issued for the construction of Manimandapam at a cost of Rupees 4 Crore in Vazhuthareddy Village, Villupuram District for the 21 martyrs who lost their lives because of police firing in the struggle for social justice in 1987. The construction works are to be commenced soon.

# WORKS RELATED TO OTHER ANNOUNCEMENTS OF THE HON'BLE CHIEF MINISTER

The construction of full-size statue of Rao Bahadhur Cruz Fernandes at Thoothukudi has been accorded at a cost of Rupees 77 Lakh and 87 Thousand. Construction works are in progress.

Orders have been issued for the renovation of V.O.Chidambaranar Memorial House at Ottapidaram and Manimandapam at Tirunelveli. To benefit everyone by learning his life history, a light and sound show set up and the renovation work has been completed at a cost of Rupees 72 Lakh and 49 Thousand.

# WORKS RELATED TO ANNOUNCEMENTS OF THE INFORMATION DEPARMENT

A statue is to be installed for the Freedom Fighter Anjalai Ammal, who had actively participated in the non-cooperation movement, and was addressed as the 'Jansi Rani of South India' by Mahatma Gandhi, at Gandhi Park, Muthu Nagar, Cuddalore and construction works are in progress. A statue is to be installed for the former President of India who was also India's leading scientist and charismatic idol of the students, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam at Anna University Campus, Chennai and construction works are in progress.

A statue is to be installed for Rabindranath Tagore, a Nobel Prize Laureate and a Bengal Poet who penned the National Anthem at Queen Mary's College Campus, Chennai and construction works are in progress.

A statue is to be installed for Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar, who was a Social Reformer, Writer and Eminent person in Dravidian Movement and in the abolition of the Devadasi system, at Mayiladuthurai and construction works are in progress.

A statue is to be installed for Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy who was the first Woman Legislator, Leader of the Women's Indian Association, Social Reformer and a Doctor in the

Government Medical College, Pudukottai and construction works are in progress.

To commemorate the 75<sup>th</sup> year of India's Independence, memorials of freedom fighters is to be renovated and setting up of light and sound shows, short films about the biographies of leaders of the Indian Independence movement and photo exhibitions are to be done. In the first phase, the light and sound show is going to be set up in 6 memorials and the cost estimate has been received and work is in progress.

For Renovating the Gandhi Museum, which commemorates the martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the motherland and the Memorials of Perunthalaivar Kamarajar where his body was buried, Periyavar Bhakthavatchalam and Mootharignar Rajaji at Gandhi Mandapam premises, Guindy, at a cost of Rupees 3 Crore 36 Lakh and 82 Thousand and the works are nearing completion.

Rupees 2 Crore 53 Lakh and 26 Thousand has been accorded for installing a statue at Udumalaipettai Municipal Office premises, Tiruppur District and for constructing an Arangam near Thirumoorthy Dam for Thali Palayakarar Malaiyandi Venkidupathi Ethalappar Nayakar. The construction works are to be commenced soon.

Orders have been issued for renovating a Memorial for those who died in the Coimbatore District Parambikulam Aliyar Project works at Aliyar Dam park for Rupees One Crore.

The office premises of the Chief Engineer, Water Resources Department in Pollachi has now been named after the former Union Minister Thiru. C. Subramaniyam as 'C. Subramaniyam Valagam'.

In this office premises, a two storied building with two Arangams is to be built to facilitate the conduct of training and seminars for the benefit of farmers, and the Arangam in the ground floor is to be named as 'V.K. Palanisamy Arangam' and the Arangam in the upper floor as 'Pollachi Na.Mahalingam Arangam'. Also along with the construction of these Arangams, within the office premises, the statues of V.K. Palanisamy Gounder, Former Union Minister C.Subramaniyam and Industrialist Pollachi N. Mahalingam are to be installed, at a total cost of Rupees 4 crore 28 Lakh and 71 Thousand. The works are to be commenced soon.

Rupees 17 Lakh and 50 Thousand has been accorded for installing а statue of former of Chief Minister Madras Presidency Dr. Pa.Subbarayan, a Freedom fighter who toiled for Tamil language and Tamil people and passed legislations based on principles of Social justice at Gandhi Mandapam, Chennai and works are in progress. Also, orders have been issued for constructing an Arangam in his name, at a cost of Rupees 2 Crore and 50 Lakh in Namakkal District.

Rupees 2 Crore and 60 Lakh has been accorded for constructing an Arangam and statue in memory of Thiru. Eswaran, a former Member of the Legislative Assembly and freedom fighter who underwent eleven years of imprisonment, who was instrumental in bringing Keezh Bhavani Irrigation Scheme which caters to the need of irrigating 2 Lakh acres of land in Kongu Region, at Bhavani Sagar in Erode District. The foundation stone is to be laid very soon by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu.

Orders have been issued for installing a statue for constructing an and Arangam for Thiru A. Govindasamy, a former Minister in the Perarignar cabinet of Anna and of Muthamizharignar Kalaignar, who also greatly contributed towards the upliftment of the poor people, at Vazhudhareddy Village, Villupuram District at a cost of Rupees 2 Crore and 60 Lakh. The work is to be commenced soon.

Rupees One Crore has been accorded for construction of Statue with Manimandapam for Veeramamunivar at Saint Paralogamatha Church campus, Kamanayakkanpatti, Thoothukudi District and the construction works are in progress.

# STATUE FOR FREEDOM FIGHTERS AND LEADERS

At the Gandhi Mandapam premises, Guindy, Chennai, a full size statue of freedom fighter Panjalankurichi King Veera Pandiya Kattabomman, who fought against the British and was hanged, and a statue of freedom fighters Maruthu Brothers, who ruled Sivagangai Seemai and the bust size statue of V.O.Chidambaranar installed in his renovated memorial, where the oil press pulled by him when he was in prison has been kept, were unveiled by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 14.02.2023.

# WORKS IN PROGRESS AND WORKS TO BE COMMENCED

Rupees 40 Lakh and 42 Thousand has been accorded to install a full size statue for V.O.Chidambaranar at VOC Park in Coimbatore. The construction works are to be completed soon.

In order to commemorate the Centenary Celebrations of Pudukottai King Raja Gopala Thondaiman, a Memorial with Museum is to be constructed for him at Pudukottai at a cost of Rupees 3 Crore and 3 Lakh. Rupees 3 Crore has been accorded for the construction of a statue and Arangam at Mayiladuthurai for Mayuram Muncif Vedha Nayagam Pillai, who wrote the first Tamil Novel. The works are to be commenced soon.

Upgradation of 10 Memorials as study centers for the students preparing for competitive exams with basic amenities and additional facilities, at a cost of Rupees One Crore is in progress.

In the Memorials, Manimandapams and Arangams that have been established by the Department of Information and Public Relations for various Freedom Fighters, Tamil Scholars and important leaders, their life history, photo albums, the books written by them and those books written on them will be displayed. Short films on each of the leaders will be telecasted in their respective memorials using LED TV, in first phase, LED TV to be installed in 15 different places and also, 360 degree photos of memorials will be taken and uploaded in websites and social

media and QR codes will be created and uploaded for every memorial, so that the public can access it with ease. These works are to be carried out at a cost of Rupees 2 Crore.

The bust-size statue of Freedom Fighter Veeran Sundaralingam is to be replaced with his full-size statue riding a horse at Veeran Sundaralingam Memorial, Governagiri, Thoothukudi District at a cost of Rupees 40 Lakh.

A full size bronze statue of Former Minister Perasiriyar Anbazhaganar has been installed at 'Perasiriyar Anbazhaganar Kalvi Valagam' in Nungambakkam, Chennai and is ready to be unveiled soon.

Necessary arrangements are made for the Press Meets. This section also coordinates with the Press and provides all the facilities required for the news reporters and television wing, for them to gather news regarding Government functions and dignitaries' visits to the State.

Important announcements, Press Releases and video footage and photographs of important events released by the Headquarters are uploaded immediately in the Information and Public Relations Department's website (www.dipr.tn.gov.in) and made available to the media. Similarly, Video footage of important events are being sent immediately to the District Information and Public Relations Office of all districts through email, so that the media in the districts can publish them in their editions as well.



As per the guidance of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, an announcement was made by Hon'ble Minister for Information and Publicity in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly, during the Assembly session 2021–22 on 20.01.2022, and the 'Social Media Section' was created.

A separate Social Media Section had been created in the Department which deals with the updation of official Press Releases, news, achievements, photographs and programmes of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on the Social Media platforms like Twitter, Instagram, Facebook and YouTube.

The Information regarding financial Budget and Agricultural Budget tabled this year had reached crores of people through SMS and Other Social Media Platform to their phone. We consider this a milestone for the Social Media Section with a greater pride.



Tamil Nadu Films Division provides video coverage of all functions attended by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Ministers, important dignitatrie, the proceedings of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly, other Government programmes and also create awareness among the public regarding the welfare schemes announced by the Government.

All the video recordings of the various programmes which are done by Films division are sent as press clippings through the Tamil Nadu Films Division social media handles which is broadcasted throughout Tamil Nadu and is universally accessible to people around the world.

The important Government Programmes are compiled as video news magazines with commentary and background music and sent to Arasu Cable TV, all District Information and Public Relations offices to be screened on LED screens, and on social media to create public awareness.

Tamil Nadu Films Division plays a major role by producing video news magazines on various welfare schemes of the Government. announcements, achievements and depending on the social changes that are occurring in the society and awareness regarding social welfare. These Video News Magazines, Short films and Jingles are produced in updated theatrical versions and telecasted in all Digital Cinema theatres, Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV, all LED in Collectorates and to all District screens Information and Public Relations Offices to be screened in LED Vans, thereby creating public awareness about various welfare schemes of the Government.

#### SOCIAL MEDIA

Under the guidance of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, the new official YouTube channel of the Films Division was launched on 16.07.2021 and started uploading welfare programmes provided by the Government of Tamil Nadu on social media. Also, all the Government programmes are videotaped and uploaded as news packages with background voice and music through the Tamil Nadu Film Division's social media website (Tamil Nadu Film Division - YouTube) which is broadcasted throughout Tamil Nadu and this universal access to people around the world. Until now 2500 videos have been uploaded with 9100 subscribers and Lakh of visitors have viewed so far.

# THIRAIYIL BHARATHI

"Thiraiyil Bharathi", a music event that exclusively featured Bharathiyar's songs in films, was held at Kalaivanar Arangam, Chennai on 23.07.2022. The Hon'ble Minister for Youth Welfare and Sports Development Thiru. Udhayanidhi Stalin inaugurated the music event.

The Hon'ble Ministers, Members of Parliament and Legislative Assembly, Representatives of Local Bodies and other dignitaries participated and graced the occasion. School students watched the music event and benefitted from it.

#### **"BHARATHI YAAR?"**

the year 2020-21, the Hon'ble Īn Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu announced that "To produce Bharathiyar's creations in the form of short films and plays, funds will be given and necessary action will be taken for these to be released through modern media". In line with that, a programme named "Bharathi Yaar?" was presided over by me at the Anna Centenary Library Auditorium, Chennai on 07.12.2022. This program was greatly enjoyed by the school students. Also, necessary actions are being taken for this program to be conducted in other districts as Coimbatore, Salem, Madurai such and Tirunelveli.



Through the Photo Section that is functioning under the Information and Public Relations Department, photographs are taken at Government Functions graced by those the presence of the Hon'ble President of India, the Hon'ble Vice President of India, the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu and the Hon'ble Ministers. The photographers in the District Information and offices Relations Public are working in coordination with the District Collectors and officers of all Departments.

The photographs taken by the photographers in Secretariat are sent to the Media through Press Release Section and also displayed for the public view at the Secretariat and at the Tamil Nadu House in New Delhi.

The photographs taken by district Public Relations offices are sent to the media within those districts and also displayed in the Collectorate Panel Boards and in the mini photo exhibitions in important Government functions for public viewing. Also, in our Department's publication, Tamilarasu (Tamil and English) editions, photographs are published along with articles for the easy understanding of the readers.

In addition, photographs of the new schemes inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu are published in the Achievement books, Special Issues and Coffee Table Books for public awareness, through the Tamilarasu Press. after this Government took charge, 23 issues have been released.

All the photographs taken by the department photographers are preserved for future reference in Hard Discs.



The Reference Section collects everyday important news articles from all newspapers, periodicals and other State newspapers, categorizes them daily and brings them to the notice of the concerned Government Departments as well.

The important news from morning and evening dailies, periodicals and other State newspapers are all consolidated by the Reference Section as news clippings and are submitted every day to the Hon'ble Chief Minister and the Chief Secretary in file format. Necessary actions being taken through the concerned are departments. Also, according to the policy of going paperless, news clippings are being sent as e-newspapers now, on a trial-run basis.

In addition, complaints and adverse news published on various Government departments scanned and sent to their respective are Secretaries, Heads of Departments and the District Collectors through WhatsApp immediately. The reply is also received from them and necessary actions are taken for their release to the media. Furthermore, important newspapers preserved as bound volumes for future are reference. Important Press clippings published in the newspapers are given immediately even during the Legislative Assembly sessions and a copy is sent to the offices of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Ministers and Secretaries to Government, as per their request.

The Field Publicity section is functioning with a motive to publicize the schemes and achievement of the Government headed by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu among the public.

### **ZONAL OFFICERS**

After the Government took charge, all 38 districts in the State has been divided into 6 zones, for speedy coordination and execution of Government schemes in the districts, and the six Joint Directors posted in the Information and Public Relations Department have been given additional charge to monitor the workings of the PROs of districts in their respective zones.

## **PUBLICITY THROUGH LED SCREEN VAN**

LED screen Hi-tech vans with state-of-theart technology have been given to 32 Districts. During the day and night, in public places where people gather in large numbers, these vans screen awareness short films and video news magazines Government schemes, on achievements, policies and announcements of the Government and thus field publicity works are being undertaken in such way for public viewing public **benefit** awareness and to create themselves.

## **PUBLICITY THROUGH LED SCREENS**

Field publicity is being carried out by screening the awareness short films and video news magazines produced by the Information and Public Relations Department on Government schemes and achievements using LED screens, in places such as thirty two District Collectorates, three Taluk offices in Chennai and Tamil Nadu House in New Delhi, where people visit in large numbers.



The Information and Public Relations Department does the work of releasing all the advertisements for Government Departments, Boards, Universities, and Government undertakings in dailies and periodicals.

Advertisements and details relating to tenders on various development works and other works, land acquisition are also released to the newspapers through this Department at rates fixed by the Government.

Advertisements on achievements, schemes, policies and social welfare works of the Government are released by the Information and Public Relations Department in dailies, periodicals, electronic media and social media for the awareness and for the benefit of the public. The Advertisements are released in Newspapers based on their importance, the target area and the target audience.

### **TENDER ADVERTISEMENTS**

Details about Government tender are released using advertisements modern electronic technology to reach the public easily without additional expenditure on the Government www.tenders.tn.gov.in through website the National Informatics Center (NIC).

Transparency in Government administration ensures the tender advertisements are released in newspapers at the rates prescribed by the Government and uploaded free of cost on the Government website as well. This facilitates the participation of all eligible persons in Government tenders without any partiality.

### **TENDER BULLETINS**

To ensure complete transparency in the Government functioning, under the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tenders Act, 1998 and the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Rules 2000 framed there under, the Districts/State Tender Bulletins are released every week on Thursday giving detailed information about the tenders of the Government.

Details regarding the Rs.25 Lakh to Rs.50 Lakh procurement Estimates and Rs.50 Lakh to Rs.75 Lakh work Estimates are released in District Tender Bulletins and about the procurement estimates above Rs.50 Lakh and work estimates above Rs.75 Lakh are released in the State Tender Bulletin.

Decisions taken on the tenders are also published in these bulletins.

### WORK UNDER PROCESS

Actions are being taken by the National Informatics Center for the future development and maintenance of software to carry out all government advertising activities through online.

As a first phase, 10 Digital walls are installed at important public places such as bus stands and markets to broadcast of Government news and programmes to reach the public immediately.



In the Media Centre located at the Secretariat Main Building, the announcements of the Hon'ble Chief Minister and Government news which are being telecasted in 15 television News channels are being recorded.

The Press Releases, Press Notes and Photographs released by the Secretariat are sent from the Media Centre to all the dailies and media houses in Chennai. They are also sent to all the District Information and Public Relations Officers from the Media Centre, for necessary action to get them published in the district dailies.

The District Information and Public Relations Officers send the details of the publication of these news items in the districts every day to the Media Centre. Details regarding the publication of Press Releases, Press Notes and Photographs of the programmes of the Hon'ble Chief Minister in the district dailies are received through the mail daily, compiled and monitored through the Media Centre.



Exhibitions are being organized in all districts by the Information and Public Relations Department on behalf of the Government of Tamil Nadu to enable people to understand the achievements and activities and avail themselves of the schemes of the various departments of the Government.

Union and State Government Departments, Public Undertakings and Private Organizations participate in Government exhibitions to expedite various achievements of their departments. These Government Exhibitions also serve as a channel for direct and indirect employment for traders and others, in addition to giving entertainment to the public. Also, opportunities are provided for indigent drama artists to host their cultural programmes to raise their standard of living.

Every year, Government Exhibitions are conducted in 10 Districts, wherein regular Government Exhibitions are being conducted at Coimbatore, Madurai, Salem, Vellore, Tirunelveli, Tiruchirapalli and Vellore and other 4 Government Exhibitions are conducted in other districts on a rotational basis. In the year 2022-23, the exhibition conducted had a footfall of 7,42,150 persons and through this, Rupees 3 Crore 7 Lakh and 46 Thousand was earned as revenue by the Government.

An honorarium of Rs.5000/- is being given to Indigent drama artists for conducting plays/awareness programmes in the Government exhibitions.

#### **PRIVATE EXHIBITIONS**

Permission for conducting a private exhibition for more than 3 days in the districts is accorded by Information and Public Relations Department with recommendations obtained from District Collectors with the duly enclosures, necessary permissions from relevant departments and a cheque for the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund as fixed by the Government. The Private Exhibitions are conducted by following the guidelines framed by this department. Permission is accorded by District Collectors only after receiving Demand Drafts of the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund. Through the private exhibition conducted from 07.05.2021 to 24.03.2023, Rupees 2 Crore 71 Lakh 57 Thousand was received for the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund.

## TAMIL NADU IN THE FREEDOM STRUGGLE - PHOTO EXHIBITION

The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu inaugurated a photo exhibition titled 'Tamil Nadu in the Freedom struggle' in the Chennai Mofussil Bus Terminus at Koyambedu, Chennai on 01.11.2021, as a continuation of the

Independence Day celebrations. 75th The exhibition displayed the photographs of freedom fighters from Tamil Nadu, who sacrificed their lives and underwent untold suffering and trauma during the country's Freedom Struggle. The 14-day exhibition displayed the historic collection of various events during the Freedom Struggle, photographs of women who played a major role in the freedom movement, photographs and facts about those freedom fighters whose role hitherto was not known to the public, old coins with the engravings of freedom fighters, commemorative stamps and photos of freedom fighters. A large number of college and school students and persons who were preparing for competitive enthusiastically examinations visited the exhibition and benefited. This show which took place for 127 days, received a tremendous response from the people.

### **MOBILE PHOTO EXHIBITION**

On the occasion of the 150th birth anniversary of Kappalottiya Thamizhan V.O.Chidambaranar, a mobile photo exhibition was set up in a State Transport Corporation Bus which was to travel across the State was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 01.11.2021. The school students in the various districts visited the exhibition to know more about the life history of V.O. Chidambaranar and benefit from it.

### ANNUAL FLOWER FESTIVAL IN NEW DELHI (PHOOL WALON KI SAIRE)

Every year, the Information and Public Relations Department represents the Government of Tamil Nadu in the Annual Flower Festival (Phool Walon Ki Saire) held in New Delhi for the promotion of National Integration and Religious Harmony and has been winning prizes consequently for years together.

## **REPUBLIC DAY PAGEANTRY PROCESSION**

On behalf of the Government of Tamil Nadu, the Information and Public Relations Department participates in the pageantry of floats at the Republic Day Celebrations in New Delhi every year by designing the float according to the theme recommended by the High Level Committee. It also participates in the cultural programme with the talented artists receiving tremendous appreciation from the viewers and bringing laurels to Tamil Nadu.

The Information and Public Relations Department participated in the pageantry float in the the vear 2023 theme "Women on Empowerment and Culture" portraying the seven Tamil Nadu Women who have achieved in various fields and drew the attention of the audience of the program.

The Information and Public Relations Department participates in the pageantry of floats at the Republic Day Celebrations in Chennai every year. Also, the department co-ordinates the designing of floats and the procession of the pageantry of floats of various Departments of the Government of Tamil Nadu. In the Republic Day Celebrations of the year 2023 at Chennai, the tableau of the Information and Public Relations Department participated and won the third prize.

During the previous year 2022, in the Republic Day celebrations which took place in Chennai, three tableaux participated in the pageantry portraying the participation of Tamil Nadu in the freedom struggle. Because these tableaus were rejected for the procession at New Delhi, to enable the people of all districts to view these tableaus and benefit from them, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu flagged its tour around the State, on 26.01.2022.

The above-mentioned three tableaus travelled around 7000 km across most of the districts of Tamil Nadu.

### INDIA TOURIST AND INDUSTRIAL FAIR

The Information and Public Relations Department participates in the India Tourist and Industrial Fair at Chennai every year and puts up a separate pavilion showcasing the policies, activities and achievements of the Government depicting photographs and models to educate and create awareness among the public.

This year, at the 47<sup>th</sup> India Tourism and Industrial Exhibition which was held at Island Grounds, Chennai, the Information and Public Relations Department was presented with the second prize for the best innovative concept, by designing a model of Manimandapam of Ki. Rajanarayanan, the father of Karisal literature, in order to explain the Government's projects and achievements.

## INDIA INTERNATIONAL TRADE FAIR, NEW DELHI

The Information and Public Relations Department also participates in the India International Trade Fair (I.I.T.F) held in New Delhi from November 14 to 27 every year for 14 days. On behalf of the Government of Tamil Nadu, The pavilion of the Information and Public Relations Department inaugurated by was me on 17.11.2022. Photographs and models are set up attractively about the achievements, schemes, policies and developmental works of the various departments of the Government of Tamil Nadu and the arenas are designed in a way that all the people get to know about the welfare schemes and achievements of the Government of Tamil Nadu and the guidelines for the beneficiaries to avail welfare scheme benefits.

As the Fair is conducted at the national level, the participating States will have the opportunity to know about the schemes and achievements of the Government of Tamil Nadu. It also creates a national level marketing opportunity for the products made by the women's Self Help Groups of our State.

In this exhibition, the folk dances are also performed and is organized by keeping in mind that the people of other States will also get to see the tradition and culture of Tamil Nadu and the socio-economic condition of the folk artists.

## PHOTO EXHIBITION ON GOVERNMENT'S ACHIEVEMENTS

A sum of Rupees 10 Thousand is sanctioned every year per district to conduct an annual photo exhibition on the Government's Achievements in all District headquarters of Tamil Nadu including Chennai District, to facilitate people get awareness of the welfare schemes and activities of the Government.

A sum of Rupees 10 Lakh per district, totalling to Rupees 3 Crore and 80 Lakh, has been sanctioned to 38 Districts for the year of 2022, to conduct annual photo exhibitions on Government's Achievements (ஓயா உழைப்பின் ஓராண்டு). The public visited the exhibitions with great interest.

# DISTRICT INFORMATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICES

The District Information and Public Relations Offices does field publicity by publicizing the Government developmental schemes, achievements and new announcements to the people who are the beneficiaries of these initiatives by the Government, and to all parts of the district, through media such as newspapers, television and radio, etc.

The Public Relations Offices in the Districts function with the Information and Public Relations Officer, Assistant Public Relations Officer (Information), Assistant Public Relations Officer (Publicity) and supporting staff work with dedication in disseminating information on people's welfare schemes, achievements and new announcements instantly.

In order to take the information about Government schemes to the people of all sections, field publicity works are being carried out through newspapers, visual media, LED vans and photo exhibitions.

The District Information and Public Relations Officers and Assistant Officers make arrangements for the press meets given by the District Collector regarding the schemes and development works, collect success stories from beneficiaries and get them published in the newspapers, arranging press tours, screening of short films and video magazines through LED Video Van, Theatre inspections to check the screening of Government's video news magazine, Tamilarasu magazine, subscriptions for pamphlets, bit notices and updating social media handles. Based on these works, marks are awarded and a monthly ranking is done, upon which due advice is given.

## **INFORMATION CENTRES**

Information Centres are functioning efficiently in Chennai, Madurai, Tiruchirappalli, Thanjavur, Coimbatore and New Delhi under the Information and Public Relations Department.

Books on language and literature, history and science, etc., along with newspapers and periodicals are made available in these Information Centres for the use of the public. These Information Centres are used by research scholars, teachers and students of schools and colleges.

## STATE INFORMATION CENTRE, CHENNAI

The State Information Centre is functioning Chennai Kalaivanar Arangam under the at Information and Public Relations Department. A Library is functioning at the State Information Centre for the benefit of all. The Library contains around 69,295 books in Tamil and English on various subjects including Tamil Literature, Science, Research Articles, Law, Medicine, Psychology, Spirituality, Astrology, Physical Education, Yoga, History, Politics, Culture, Education, Biographies of Political Leaders, Novels, Short Stories, Poems and all kinds of competitive examination notes. These books are available in a well maintained calm and neat environment for the Public, Scientists, Artists, Students and Professors.

Tamil and English Daily Newspapers and periodical magazines are also available in this library. Publications of Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly and other Government Publications are compiled and maintained for reference.

School and College students visit this library regularly to take notes for their education and to take part in various literary competitions such as oratorical, essay writing, poetry writing and quizzes conducted in schools and colleges. It also has to be mentioned that the library has a vast variety of books for competitive examinations exclusively for the use of students preparing for them.

This State Information Centre Library has obtained two copies of the books published by various publishers for the purpose of copyright registration and the copyright information contained in the books is being duly recorded and maintained here.

The highlight of the State Information Centre Library is that it has a modern software facility to help the students and public who visit the library to access a particular book easily among the 69,295 books of the library.

To preserve books for future generations, under the Government of Tamil Nadu's scheme of setting up e-libraries, out of all the books in the State Information Centre about 2,500 books with no copyright issues have been selected and digitalized by the Anna Centenary Library on behalf of the Public Library Mission.

## INFORMATION CENTRE, TAMIL NADU HOUSE, NEW DELHI

The Information Centre has been functioning since 1993 in Vaigai, Tamil Nadu House, New Delhi.

The Information Centre coordinates with the media when the Hon'ble Governor, the Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers of Tamil Nadu visits New Delhi to meet the Hon'ble President of India, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and Hon'ble Union Ministers. Information Centre works with the Prime Minister's Office, Office of the Press Secretary to the Hon'ble President of India and offices of the Union Ministers for collection of Photos and Visuals of the Hon'ble Governor and the Hon'ble Chief Minister, and provides them to the media for publishing and telecasting.

In addition to this, the Information Centre coordinates the participation of the Tamil Nadu Government in the India International Trade Fair every year in ITPO, New Delhi and the annual event of Phool Walon Ki Sair, and also coordinates the participation in Republic Day Tableaux of Tamil Nadu during the Republic Day Celebration at New Delhi.

The Information Centre also coordinates with the office of the Resident Commissioners for the Independence Day Programmes on August 15, organized by the Ministry of Defence (Bharat Parv, Guest of States at Red Fort). It also coordinates with the office of the Resident Commissioners for the conduct of 'Pongal Vizha' in Tamil Nadu House and 'Tamil Nadu Day' activities every year. It also arranges and coordinates all public functions and meetings of the Hon'ble Special Representative of the Government of Tamil Nadu at New Delhi and the Resident Commissioners.

The Information Centre is also involved in works of liaising with the Ministries of the Government of India for the Information and Public Relations Department like the issue of Commemorative coins and stamps. It also follows Supreme Court cases relating to the the Information and Public Relations Department. It provides vital information on current affairs, Government, Judicial and Political developments, Social Media trends to the Director of Information and Public Relations department and Resident Commissioners on a day to day basis. Τt maintains and updates digital video and photo displays at Tamil Nadu House, oversees periodical maintenance and change of display photos in the dignitaries Corridor of Tamil Nadu House.

A media centre for the working purpose of Journalists is also maintained by the Information Centre at the Vaigai Illam, New Delhi.



Following the keen interest and strenuous efforts of Muthamizharignar Kalaignar, Tamilarasu magazine was started on July 1, 1970, by combining all the Government magazines which were till then publishing welfare schemes of the the Government Government and policies separately. Now, Tamilarasu is published every month both in Tamil and English, on behalf of the Department of Information and Public Relations, Government of Tamil Nadu. It has been the print media of the Government of Tamil Nadu for the past 53 years, as it compiles the policies of the Government, all the welfare schemes implemented by the Government for the poor and needy people and the achievements of the schemes.

## TAMILARASU SPECIAL PUBLICATIONS SALES AT THE BOOK FAIR FOR THE FIRST TIME

Also for the first time in the history of 53 years of Tamilarasu, the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu inaugurated the first special issue for sale at the 'Tamilarasu' arena, in the book fair held in Chennai on 06.01.2023, intending to make everyone buy, read and benefit from the special issues compiled and published by the 'Tamilarasu' Press at a concessional price.

Tamilarasu Press will continue to sell special issues at concessional price with the aim of increasing the reading ability of the younger generation.



### PENSION FOR JOURNALISTS

The Government provides a monthly pension to retired Journalists, who toil day and night to present the news to the public, so that they don't face hardship after retirement. Monthly pension is provided to the retired journalists who rendered 20 years of service and are in indigent conditions.

A sum of Rupees Ten Thousand is now given as a monthly pension to the journalists. During the period 2022-23, Journalists' pensions have been sanctioned to 50 Journalists and at present, 282 persons are getting the pension.

## JOURNALIST FAMILY PENSION

Family pension is being given to the Spouse of the deceased Journalists who had availed pension taking into consideration the welfare of the family. A sum of Rupees Five Thousand is now given as Family Pension. During the period 2022-23, Journalist Family Pension have been sanctioned to 12 persons and at present, 59 persons are benefited by the family pension scheme.

## JOURNALISTS' FAMILY BENEFIT FUND

Journalists' Family Benefit Fund is being given from the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund to families of Journalists who die while serving as Editor/ Sub-Editor/ Reporter/ Photographer/ Proof Reader as below:-

During the period 2022-23, Family benefit fund have been sanctioned to 19 persons and at present, 86 persons are getting the benefits.

### JOURNALISTS WELFARE FUND

A sum of Rupees One Crore has been allocated for the Journalists Welfare Fund as Corpus Fund and it has been deposited in the Tamil Nadu Power Finance and Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited. The maximum amount of the Welfare Fund for medical treatment of Journalists in service, who suffer from serious illnesses, is Rupees 2 Lakh and 50 Thousand only. This fund is generated from the interest accumulated from the deposit of Rupees One Crore.

## **GOVERNMENT RENTAL HOUSING**

Journalists working in the media have been allocated 143 quarters at concessional rent in the Tamil Nadu Housing Board flats in Chennai and other Districts, under Government's discretionary quota.

## **HOUSE SITES**

Journalists of dailies and TV Channels working in the Districts are provided with 1,317 house sites at concessional rates with the consent of the District Collector through the Revenue and Disaster Management Department.

## ACCREDITATION CARDS

To enable media personnel to gather the news at Hon'ble Chief Minister's functions and the functions of important dignitaries, Media personnel working in newspapers/television channels/news agencies are provided with Accreditation Card.

729 Accreditation Cards in Chennai and 140 Accreditation Cards in other Districts, totally 869 Accreditation Cards have been issued to the Media persons in the year 2022-23.

## PRESS PASS FOR PERIODICALS

Press Pass is given to the Journalists of periodicals to enable them to gather news at important places. 479 Press Pass Cards have been issued to journalists in the current year.

## **BUS PASSES AT NO COST TO JOURNALISTS**

Those Journalists provided with Accreditation Cards are given bus passes to travel at no cost in buses of Government Transport Corporation, numbering 420 persons in Chennai and Villupuram 2,958 persons in other districts, totally 3,378 passes have been issued.

## PRESS ROOM

The Press Room in the Secretariat is equipped with all facilities for sending news immediately.

### KALAIGNAR EZHUTHUKOL VIRUDHU

As per the announcement made by the department, orders have been issued for awarding Kalaignar Ezhuthukol Virudhu with a prize amount of Rupees 5 Lakh and a certificate to a journalist every year who contributes to the development of downtrodden people and for the social upliftment through his/her writings. Orders have also been issued forming the selection committee to select the awardee. This award will be presented every year on June 3, the birth anniversary of Muthamizharignar Kalaignar.

Accordingly, in the previous year, Thiru.I. Shanmuganathan who had worked in the Dinathanthi Newspaper was given the Kalaignar Ezhuthukol Virudhu on 03.06.2022.



As per the guidance of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, an announcement was made by Hon'ble Minister for Information and Publicity in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly, during the Assembly session 2021–22 on 06.09.2021, regarding the formation of a Journalist Welfare Board.

Accordingly, a Journalist Welfare Board has been constituted and the funds are determined to provide welfare assistance for various welfare schemes.

The Hon'ble Chief Minister has honoured the working journalists in Tamil Nadu by announcing them as front line workers for the first time, as a recognition to the selfless work rendered by them during the COVID pandemic.

### JOURNALIST WELFARE FUND

To generate revenue for Tamil Nadu Journalist Welfare Board, Government has ordered to deduct 1% of Advertisement charges to Tamil Nadu Journalist Welfare Board from various advertising agencies.

Tamil Nadu Journalist Welfare Board meetings have been conducted four times to discuss the various welfare schemes for Journalists.

The Journalist Welfare Board Committee has been constituted with the Minister for Information and Publicity as the Chairman, seven official members and six non-official members to scrutinize the applications and to extend assistance to the members.



Muthamizharignar Kalaignar informed that "several welfare boards were formed to safeguard the livelihood of labourers and welfare assistance was being provided to them" while speaking at the All India Cine workers conference on 09.10.2009. At that conference, he announced that a new Cine Workers Welfare Board would be formed for the welfare of Cine workers, including small screen workers, after considering the requests of the South Indian Artistes Association and the Tamil film industry.

In continuation to his announcement, the Cine Workers Welfare Board was formed with the Minister for Information and Publicity as the President, the Director of Information and Public Relations Department as Member Secretary, and official and non-official members.

So far, 39 associations of the Tamil Nadu Film and Television Industries have been enrolled with 26,792 members.

### **FILM AWARDS**

To encourage the Tamil film industry in its attempts, to take the Tamil Culture and its manifold wonders around the world, the Government of Tamil Nadu have been presenting film awards since 1968 for the best Tamil Films, best Actors, best actresses and best technicians.

The Government of Tamil Nadu has a Selection committee to select the best feature films, best actors, best actresses, best technicians and best films selected by the selection committee. The winners are given a cash prize of Rupees 2 Lakh for the first prize, Rupees 1 Lakh for the second prize, Rupees 75 Thousand for the third prize and Rupees 75 Thousand for the

special prize along with a memento and a certificate.

Another special prize comprising a Cash Award for Rupees 1 Lakh and 25 Thousand, along with a memento and a certificate is awarded to a Tamil film which portrays women in a positive light.

A five sovereign gold medal, a memento and a certificate are given to the Best Actor, Best Actress, Best Actor (special prize), Best Actress (special prize), Best Villain Actor, Best Comedy Actor, Best Comedy Actress, Best Character Actor, Best Character Actress, Best Director, Best Screenplay Writer, Best Dialogue Writer, Best Music Director, Best Lyricist, Best Playback Singer (Male), Best Playback Singer (Female), Best Cinematographer, Best Sound Recordist, Best Film Editor, Best Art Director, Best Stunt Master, Best Dance Master, Best Makeup Artiste, Best Costume Designer, Best Child Artiste, Best Dubbing Artiste (Male) and Best Dubbing Artiste (Female).

In the year 2017, a Government order was issued for giving away the Film awards for the years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and 2014 to 101 artists, but the prize distribution did not take place. As per the order of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, the awards were distributed to the awardees, at the prize distribution function held at Kalaivanar Arangam, on 04.09.2022. In the function, the Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Hon'ble Minister for Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments and myself as the Minister for Information and Publicity presented cheques to 23 producers of the best films and a five Sovereign gold pendant, a memento and a certificate to 160 persons.

The setting up of a selection committee for the awards for the years 2015 to 2022 is in process.

### KALAIGNAR NINAIVU KALAITHURAI VITHAGAR AWARD

A Lifetime Achievement Award in the name of Muthamizharignar Kalaignar is given to the Kalaignar Ninaivu Kalaithurai Vithagar Award for outstanding achievements in the Tamil film industry.

A check of Rs.10 lakhs and a Certificate of Appreciation will be presented to the awardee selected for the Kalaignar Ninaivu Kalaithurai Vithagar Award on June 3 every year.

Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu personally visited Mr. Aroordas who has been selected for the Kalaignar Ninaivu Kalaithurai Vithagar Award 2022 at his residence and felicitated him with a cheque of Rupees 10 Lakh and a certificate of appreciation, on 03.06.2022.

#### **KALAITHURAI VITHAGAR AWARD**

Kalaithurai Vithagar Awards are presented by Tamil Nadu Government in the name of Arignar Anna, who left his unique imprint on Tamil culture through his writing, stage acting and film scripts; Kalaivanar N.S.Krishnan, who made people think through his humour; 'Ezhisai Mannar' Thyagaraja Bhagavathar, who attracted the masses with his hypnotic voice; Raja Sandow who was dynamic and multifaceted; Makkal Thilagam M.G.R., Nadigar Thilagam Sivaji Ganesan who reached the peak in the field of acting; Kaviarasu Kannadasan who penned immortal songs and former Chief Minister Selvi J Jayalalithaa.

Each of the Kalaithurai Vithagar Award winners is presented with a Five Sovereign gold pendant and a memento.

#### **GOVERNMENT FILM SUBSIDY**

To encourage producers of low budget, quality films with social responsibility and commitment, the Government of Tamil Nadu is implementing a scheme to provide subsidy to such films. A Selection committee has been constituted by the Government to select such films and every selected film is granted a subsidy of Rupees 7 Lakh.

The works for the issuance of subsidies for those quality Tamil films which were produced at low budget and released during the years 2015 to 2022 is in process.

### **SMALL SCREEN AWARDS**

The Government of Tamil Nadu is presenting Small screen Awards for Television Serials viz., Best Mega Serials, Actors, Actresses and Technicians of small screen which have a mega impact in entertaining the public in their daily life.

For the Best Mega Serial, a Cash prize of Rupees Two Lakhs for the first prize and a cash prize of Rupees One Lakh for the second prize are given along with a memento and a certificate.

Besides, three Sovereign gold pendants, a Memento and a Certificate are presented every year to the Best Story Writer, Best Screenplay writer, Best Dialogue Writer, Best Director, Best Cinematographer, Best Editor, Best Hero, Best Heroine, Best Character Artiste (male and female), Best Villain (male and female), Best Child Artiste, Best Music Director, Best Dubbing Artiste (male and female) and Best Special Effects Technician.

Cash Award for Rupees 1 Lakh, a Memento and a Certificate are given to Best Achiever of the year and Best Lifetime Achiever.

In the year 2017, a Government order was issued for giving away the Small screen awards for the years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013 and

2014 to 101 artists, but the prize distribution did not take place. As per the order of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, along with the Hon'ble Minister for Health & Family Welfare and Hon'ble Minister for Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments and myself as the Minister of this department, distributed the awards to the awardees, at the prize distribution function held at Kalaivanar Arangam, on 04.09.2022.

In this function, cheques were presented to twenty producers, and eighty one technicians of Best Mega Serials for the years 2009 to 2013 were each presented with a three Sovereign gold medal, a memento and a certificate.

The works are in process for the issuance of the small screen awards for the years 2014 to 2022.

### SUBSIDY FOR INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL

The Government of Tamil Nadu has given a subsidy of Rupees 75 Lakh for international film festivals held in Chennai.

The Government of Tamil Nadu has given a financial assistance of Rupees 10 Lakh to the International Film Festival of India held in Goa by the National Film Development Corporation (NFDC).

### AWARDS TO STUDENTS OF TAMIL NADU GOVERNMENT M.G.R FILM AND TELEVISION INSTITUTE

In the year 2017, a Government order was issued for giving away the Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute students awards for the academic years 2008-2009 to 2013-2014 to 30 students, but the prize distribution did not take place. As per the order of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, along with the Hon'ble Minister for Health & Family Welfare and Hon'ble Minister for Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments and myself as the Minister of this department these awards were distributed to the awardees, at the prize distribution function held at Kalaivanar Arangam, on 04.09.2022. To each of the awardees, one Sovereign gold medal, a cash prize of Rupees five thousand, a Memento and a certificate were awarded.

The works are under progress for the distribution of Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Training Institute Students' awards for the academic years 2014-2015 to 2020-2021.



Cinema is the primary entertainment of common man in Tamil Nadu. Cinema is a major platform for expression of creativity and provides livelihood to many artists. In recent times, it has emerged as a big business.

The Government of India had enacted the Cinematograph Act, 1952 (Central Act XXXVII of 1952), to make provision for the certification of Cinematograph films for exhibition and for regulating exhibitions. In order to promote and regulate Cinema Theatres in the State, the Government of Tamil Nadu had enacted the Tamil Nadu Cinemas (Regulation) Act, 1955. The Tamil Nadu Cinemas (Regulation) Rules, 1957, have been framed to streamline the Cinema Theatres and also ensure the availability

of basic amenities, safety, comfort and hygienic environment to the audience visiting the cinema theatres.

In Tamil Nadu, 1044 Cinema Theatres are functioning under the following categories: -

The District Collectors of all the Districts, except Chennai District are the Competent Authorities for granting of No Objection Certificate to construct cinema theatres and also the licensing authority to issue 'C' Form license for screening of movies in cinema theatres, as per the provisions made in the Tamil Nadu Cinemas (Regulation) Act, 1955. In respect of

Greater Chennai, the Commissioner of Police is the competent authority for granting No Objection Certificate to construct cinema theatres and for issuing 'C' Form License. As per the Tamil Nadu Cinemas (Regulation) Act, 1955, the Joint Commissioner of Revenue Administration is the Appellate Authority and the Government (Home Department) is the Revisionary Authority against the decision of the Appellate Authority, for renewal of License for exhibition of films in theatres. In addition to this, to regulate the cinema theatre business and to safeguard the interest of the cinema viewing public, the Government fixes Minimum and Maximum rates of admission to the Theatres, under relevant provisions of the said Act and Rules, in Air Conditioned and Non-Air Conditioned categories for Multiplexes and Theatres in Municipal Corporations/ Municipalities / Town Panchayats Panchayats. Under and Village special

circumstances like festivals, the Government permit special shows for screening films in Cinema Theatres. The Competent Authorities have the power to suspend exhibition of films in case of any breach of peace. Penalties shall be imposed on the owner or person in charge of the cinema theatres, in case of contravention of the provisions of the said Act or of the Rules.

### **CABLE TELEVISION NETWORK SYSTEM**

The Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act, 1995 (Central Act 7), regulates the Cable Television Network all over India. As per amended Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act, 2011 (No.21/2011) the District Magistrates, Magistrates Sub-Divisional and all Police Commissioners designated have been as Authorised Officers, in order to take action against offending Cable Television Operators for contravening sections 3, 4A, 5, 6, 8 and 9 (or) 10 of the said Act. In the State, the Commissioners of Police in concerned Cities and the Collectors of the Districts concerned in respect of other areas and the Sub-Divisional Officers in their respective local limits of Police jurisdiction, are the authorized officers to take action against the violation of the said Act. Strict action is taken against the lawbreakers who contravene the above Act.

### **VIDEO ACT AND RULES**

The Tamil Nadu Exhibition of Films on Television Screen through Video Cassette Recorders and Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act, 1984, regulates the exhibition of films on television screen through Video Cassette Recorder. This Act provides for the grant of license to the private individuals for exhibition of films on television screen through Video Cassette Recorder (VCR) and for running Video Libraries. The respective District Collectors / Commissioner of Police, Chennai are the Licensing Authorities.

### **COPYRIGHT ACT**

The Central Act viz., the Copyright Act, 1957, states that Artist is the first owner of the artistic work. This Act makes it mandatory for broadcasters – both radio and television - to pay royalty to the owners of the copyright each time a work of art is broadcasted. Whereas, this Act exempts students from the copyright laws using such material for research and education purpose. The Copyright Act, 1957, empowers the Police Officers to control the offences relating to violation of copy right, infringement pertaining to Cinematographic films, musical works, etc.

## INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHT ENFORCEMENT CELL (IPREC)

Government constituted a separate wing namely Video Piracy Cell in Tamil Nadu Police Department during the year 1995. The same was re-designated as Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell during the year 2017, to control the menace of Video Piracy and to check violations relating to the Copyright Act.

The Additional Director General of Police (Crime), Chennai is the Head of the Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell. He is assisted by Superintendent of Police and 1 Deputy 1 Superintendent of Police at the State level. At 12 Intellectual Property present, Riaht Enforcement Cell units are functioning at various places in the State namely, Chennai (2), St. Thomas Mount (1), Vellore (1), Salem (1), Coimbatore (1), Trichy (1), Cuddalore (1), Madurai (1), Dindigul (1), Virudhunagar (1) and Tirunelveli (1).

In a recent significant development, the Government has issued orders for merging of Prohibition Enforcement wing and Narcotics Intelligence Bureau, Crime Investigation Department, to form one single Composite unit viz. Enforcement Bureau CID and also to reorganize Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell.

The proposed Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell will have 06 Units viz. Headquarters Chennai, Chennai City and each 1 unit at 4 Zones [North (Vellore), West (Coimbatore), Central (Trichy), South (Madurai)], under the supervision of a Superintendent of Police, Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell (IPREC).

#### CASES REGISTERED FOR ILLEGAL TELECASTING OF NEW TAMIL MOVIES AGAINST CABLE TV OPERATORS

Based on the complaint of the film producers that new movies/songs are telecasted in Cable TV, special raids were conducted throughout Tamil Nadu. Five Cases were registered in Vellore, Virudhunagar, Tirunelveli and Cuddalore units. Computer Hard Disk with content of the telecasted movie and other new movies along with monitor and accessories were seized. 3 accused were arrested. The value of the property seized was Rs.1,21,500/-. Further, 76 cases were registered on violation of the Copyright Act by Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell and the value of the property seized was Rs.61,65,504/-.

## **NEW INITIATIVES DURING 2022-2023**

- Action is being taken against bus operators through frequent checks to curb screening of new films without valid license.
- Action is being taken against the uploading of new Tamil Movies through websites. Reports have been sent to the Commissioner of e-Governance, Tamil Nadu for recommendation and onward transmission to "CERTIN" for blocking the erring websites.
- Stringent action is being taken against the culprits who involve in the illegal recording of movies in theatres. Information regarding theatre owners who are indulging in the offence were communicated to the District Collectors concerned for necessary action, viz. sealing of theatres.

- Culprits who indulge in the violation of Cable TV Act (Regulation) 1995 and Trade Marks Act 1999, etc., are being identified and action is being taken under the Tamil Nadu Act 14/1982.
- Training would be imparted to Officers and Police Personnel relating to Stress Management, diet and healthy lifestyle.

The details of cases registered, number of accused arrested and the value of properties seized etc., by the Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell from the year 2017 to 2023 (upto 28.02.2023) are as follows: -

Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute is a leading Technical Training Institute educating Film Technology and techniques of Film Production and aesthetics of Art.

Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute functions under the Information and Public Relations Department, Government of Tamil Nadu. This institute functions in an area of 15.25 acres. This is the one and only institute in India which offers Bachelor's degree in film studies.

Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute is a pioneer Institute and has carved its own niche in the filmmaking industry and organization. This Institute was functioning as part of the branch in the Central Polytechnic Institute from 1945. Thereafter, from 1960 onwards it emerged as a separate Institute. From 09.08.2021 onwards this Institute was renamed as "Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute".

### **DEGREE COURSES**

The Diploma Courses offered by this Institute with the accreditation of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi were upgraded as four years duration Degree Course from Academic Year 2016-2017 as Bachelor of Visual Arts in affiliation with Tamil Nadu Dr. J Jayalalithaa Music and Fine Arts University.

Bachelor of Visual Arts (BVA) degree is about to be awarded from 2019-2020 instead of Diploma in Film Technology (DFT) awarded till 2018. The following degree courses are being offered by this Institute.

1.	Bachelor of Visual Arts (Cinematography)
2.	Bachelor of Visual Arts (Digital Intermediate)
3.	Bachelor of Visual Arts (Audiography)
4.	Bachelor of Visual Arts (Direction and Screenplay Writing)

6.	Bachelor of Visual Arts (Animation and Visual Effects)

### **STUDENTS ADMISSION**

During every academic year 14 students are admitted in each of the above six courses and a total of 84 students are admitted for all the courses in this Institute. Tuition fees of Rs.15,000/-, Special fees of Rs.2,000/- and Development fees of Rs.1,000/- have been fixed. SC/ST students are fully exempted from tuition fees.

### FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR FILMS PRODUCED BY STUDENTS

The Government has raised the amount for the production of Students Documentary Films from Rs.15,000 to Rs.50,000/- from the financial year 2017-18. Every year, the final year students from all the 6 courses are formed as 14 units and each unit produce a short film as the final film project.

### SHORT FILM AWARD

The students of Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute is presented with "Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute Students Award" which consists of One Sovereign Gold Medal, Cash Award of Rs.5,000/- and a Memento in the category of Best Director, Best Cinematographer, Best Editor, Best Sound Recordist and Best Colourist for their short films.

### AWARDS

The Short films produced by the students of Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute has been screened in Chennai International Film Festival and Rs.10,000/- was awarded to the selected short films.

### TRAINING ON LATEST TECHNOLOGY

In order to keep pace with the changing technology in the film industry, the students of Tamil Nadu Government M.G.R. Film and Television Institute are trained with the latest equipment and accessories on par with the film industry by hiring the latest equipment at an annual allocation of Rupees 1 Crore and 50 Lakh.
