



## **TOTAL SIZE OF THE BUDGET\*\***




#### THE STATE'S REVENUE

In 2025-26, the Government has projected its revenue receipts at Rs.3,31,569 crore. The State's own revenues constitute 75.3% of the total revenue receipts. The balance 24.7% comes from the share in Central taxes and grants-in-aid from the Union Government.



## STATE'S OWN TAX REVENUE

The Government's revenue from its own taxes are estimated to increase by 14.6% in 2025-26. The major components of the State's own tax revenue are as follows



#### THE STATE'S EXPENDITURE

The total expenditure of the Government is projected to be Rs.4,39,293 crore in 2025-26, which is an increase of 9.95% over 2024-25 (RE).

#### REVENUE EXPENDITURE

The major portion is spent on various welfare schemes for the people, especially the poor and vulnerable

The Government keeps on providing impetus to economic growth through spending for capital works. The Capital expenditure in 2025-26 is projected at Rs.57,231 crore, which is an increase of 22.4% over 2024-25 (RE)




## **REVENUE DEFICIT**

## TRENDS IN REVENUE DEFICIT RUPEES IN CRORE




## TRENDS IN REVENUE DEFICIT AS % OF GSDP




## **FISCAL DEFICIT**

The fiscal deficit as a percentage of GSDP is 3.26% this year (RE 2024-25). It will reduce to 3.00% next year (BE 2025-26).


## TRENDS IN FISCAL DEFICIT RUPEES IN CRORE




## TRENDS IN FISCAL DEFICIT AS % OF GSDP





## **GLOSSARY**

#### a) Revenue Receipts

This refers to the total receipts received on account of taxes, duties and fee, fines and penalties levied by the State and Central transfers from the Union Government

#### b) Revenue Expenditure

This includes expenditure on account of salaries, pensions and other retirement benefits, operations and maintenance, interest on outstanding loans, and subsidies and grants for welfare schemes, among others.

#### c) Capital Expenditure

This refers to expenditure towards creation of fixed assets such as roads and bridges, irrigation structures, schools, hospitals, along with investments made in Public Sector Undertakings.

#### d) Loans and Advances

This refers to lending by the Government to entities such as the State Public Sector Undertakings, Co-operative societies, etc. The recovery of such loans and advances from such institutions are treated as loan receipts.

#### e) Revenue Surplus/ Deficit

The excess of revenue receipts over the revenue expenditure is a revenue surplus. If revenue expenditure exceeds revenue receipts, it is called a revenue deficit.

#### f) Fiscal Deficit

The difference between total receipts (i.e. revenue receipts and capital receipts) and total expenditure (i.e. revenue and capital expenditure including net loans and advances) is called Fiscal Deficit.
