INTRODUCTION

It is impossible to define the origin of the world and the evolution of life on the earth, so it is nearly impossible to define the origin of language and its evolution. Tamil is differently exceptional to the general proposition that all other languages have the same nature of birth and death as all living things do.

Kumarikandam is considered to be the place where the human race originated in this world and is also known to be the place where the Tamil language originated. Originating in the southern part India, in Kumarikandam, Tamil is spoken across the Indian subcontinent and also all over the world.

The Tamil language transcends the basic character as merely being a medium of communication, and remains as a symbol of a culture that has developed and prospered within a race.

The Tamil language has been a document of human history since the dawn of time. As the ideology of Tamil language is not for a single race, but for all human races in the world, scholars all over the world are joining hands with the Tamils in preserving the language.

Our land was ruled by Cheras, Cholas and Pandiyas and later under the foreign rule, Tamil language started facing invasion of other languages. But, history revealed that Tamil, cannot be suppressed by foreign languages & Tamil grew singularly and flourished eternally as a significant language.

Immortalized by time, Tamil language is growing as a diverse and unique language, adapting itself to the development of time and the changes in science and technology.

Tamil, by its linguistic references, is referred to as Ancient Tamil, Medieval Tamil, Contemporary Tamil, etc., and by its relevance, Sangam Tamil, Divine Tamil, Modern Tamil, etc.

Clan old she is strong heart Her dad had quelled a tusker but died; her spouse took lifted cattle the next day but succumbed to the catch; hearing war drum, quick she arms her sole son with spear, covers him in silken white, smears on his locks holy oil, sees him off to Warfield swift! Isn't She diligent and daring! (Puram 279:10-11). With these Tamil verses we realise that Tamil land is a land of culture and bravery.

Classical literature such as Tolkappiyam and other Tamil literature such as Sangam literature indicate that the poets who sang Tamil were praised because of the Tamil language.

The Tamil soil where it rains all through the season, but without losses, where the fishes happily prance amidst the irrigated paddy crops, and the bee rests gently in the petals of the flowers, the overflowing udders of the cows so full, the benevolent cows that fill pots with prosperity and everlasting riches fill our lives, the thoughts were also set to flourish.

Researches on Tolkappiyam and archaeological excavations indicate that the Tamil script has a long history. The ancient Tamils, who were guided by the wind, traded overseas thousands of years ago. The touchstone at the Khlong Thom Museum in Thailand bears, the ancient Tamil inscription "Perumpathan Kal", ie, the stone of the great goldsmith. In this way, it can be reassured that ancient Tamils made sea voyages to the Eastern countries.

Even the vast ocean will stint its nature (beauty, vastness, huge volume, wealth) if the rain-cloud keeps back from raining (after thunder and lightning).

CHAPTER - 1

TAMIL DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

1. Implementation of Official Language Scheme

1.1 Inspection

Tamil is the official language of the Government of Tamil Nadu as per the Official Language Act. In accordance with the Government Orders issued on the basis of the Official Languages Act, the inspection works regarding the implementation of Official Language Schemes are being carried out by the Department of Tamil Development with a view of ensuring the usage of Tamil language in the administrative matters of all Government Departments, Boards, Corporations and Autonomous Bodies of the Government of Tamil Nadu.

Inspections, which are the primary functions of the Tamil Development Department are being carried out by the Secretary of Tamil Development and Information Department in Secretariat Departments and by the Director of Tamil

Development in Departmental Head Offices, Boards, Corporations, Government organizations and District Collectorates. Inspection works are being carried out by the Regional Deputy Directors of Tamil Development / District Deputy Directors of Tamil Development / District Assistant Directors of Tamil Development at the district level and subordinate level Government Offices.

1.2 Workshops on Official Language

In order to alleviate the difficulties and facilitate the Government personnel who work for the public in Government administration in the implementation of the Official Language Act, training classes are conducted with the Power Point Presentation on topics such as History of Official Language Act, Language Training, Preparation of Office Notes, Drafts, Proceedings, Government Orders on Implementation of Official Language Act, Inspection and Grievance Redressal Activities, Translation and Coinage of new terms. Every year, an amount of Rs.50,000/- is provided to each district to conduct workshops at all districts. In the last financial year these workshops were conducted in 38 districts.

1.3. Seminars on Official Languages:

In continuation of the successful completion of the Workshops on Official Language, Seminars on Official Language is being conducted. District Collectors, Director of Tamil Development, Government Higher Officials and Tamil Scholars take part in this seminar and felicitate the event by enumerating the greatness and uniqueness of Tamil language in Office Administration. All Government officials who took part in the Workshop on Tamil Official Language participated in this seminar and got revitalized.

1.4. Official Language Act Week

As per the provisions made in the Indian Constitutional Act, Provisions has been made to Govern the states in Majority Speaking Language. Tamil Official Language Act was enacted on 27.12.1956. In order to commemorate that event Official Language Act Week is being celebrated for a week in all districts. During that week, Awareness rallies to create awareness on Official Language Act

1.5. Official Language Training to the Government Servants of Chennai District

The number of persons working in the Head offices of all departments and their subordinate offices are high in Chennai District. Taking this into consideration, Training classes on Official Language Scheme is being conducted in 5 batches. In this training class, Training is being imparted on all subjects like the Workshop on Official Language.

1.6. Prizes for Best Notes and Drafts

2. Functions

2.1. Thiruvalluvar Day

Accordingly, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu paid floral tribute to the statue of Thiruvalluvar at Valluvar Kottam on 15.01.2022.

2.2 World Mother Tongue Day

Announcement has been made on behalf of UNESCO to celebrate 21st day of February as World Mother Tongue Day every year. Accordingly, World Mother Tongue Day is being celebrated every year by the Government of Tamil Nadu.

3. Awards

3.1. Awards Distribution (2020,2021,2022)

Every Year awards are being distributed to the Tamil Associations and Tamil Scholars who renders yeoman service for the cause of Tamil Language. Announcement has been made by the Hon’ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu enhanced the prize amount to two lakh rupee from one lakh rupee for the awardees. 4. New Schemes

4.1 Dravidian Repository

the district of their choice. The awardee can also apply and avail under the Dream House scheme even if he/she is already having a house. Houses will be allotted to a maximum of 10 awardees in each financial year. Applications are being received.

4.3. Eternal love towards Thirukkural

Programmes are being conducted like Motion pictures, Quiz competitions, Short films and dance through the collaboration with Television and Internet in order to reach Thirukkural to the Younger generation. Many more schemes are being implemented.

4.4. Tamil Propaganda Organization

Steps are being taken to develop a scheme worth of Rs.1 Crore to impart Tamil to Tamil Diaspora through the 'Tamil Virtual Academy'. The subjects will be taught in several stages, teaching from "A" to "Z" and certificate level examination will be conducted.

4.5 Coffee Table Book on Sangam Literature

An amount Rs.15 Lakh has been sanctioned to publish the Coffee Table Book on Sangam Literature's through drawing the paintings has been entrusted to the students of Government Fine Arts College to encourage their skill set.

4.6 Conducting Literary meetings

In commemoration of the birthdays of famous Tamil scholars and writers, on their Tamil literary work and yeoman service for the cause of Tamil language and contribution to the Tamil language. Administrative approval has been sanctioned an amount of Rs.15 lakh to conduct literary meeting every month, to conduct totally 12 Literary meetings by the local literary Associations in annual rotational basis and to conduct elocution competitions for the school and college students. It has been ordered to conduct literary meetings for three months and to conduct Elocution Competitions for Schools and College students during the financial year of 2021-22. An amount of Rs.1.25 lakh has been sanctioned

Based on the report reviewed by the Stationeries and Printing Department, provided by the author of the selected books, maximum financial assistance of Rs 50,000/- is being awarded. Last year, 29 books were selected and financial assistance were provided.

9. Kural Prize

This scheme was instituted by the Hon'ble former Chief Minister Muthamizh Arignar Kalaignar in the year 2000. Under this scheme, cash prize Rs. 10,000/- and a certificate of appreciation is being provided in the name of "Kural Prize" for the students who recite all the 1330 kural couplets Last year, the ceiling limit of 70 students was revoked and Kural prize amount which has to be awarded to 219 students and Rs 10,000/- has been given to each of

The works of Tamil scholars are being nationalized with the noble aim of making the works of Tamil scholars easily available and affordable cost and that the treasuries of Tamil ideas should reach out to all the people of the world. In such manner, books of 165 scholars have been nationalized till now.

14. Scheme of Printing and Publishing Nationalised books

The International Institute of Tamil Studies has undertaken the task of printing and publishing Nationalised books of Tamil Scholars. So far 200 books have been published. Printing works of 16 books are in progress. In order that their ideologies reach everyone, Financial Assistance of an amount of Rs.20 lakhs is sanctioned annually.

15. Financial Assistance to Tamil Scholars

15.1 Financial Assistance to Aged Tamil Scholars

In order to alleviate the sufferings of Tamil scholars living in poverty at their old age, Financial Assistance Scheme for Aged Tamil Scholars has been launched in the year 1978. This Financial assistance is being rendered till their life time. At present, monthly financial assistance of Rs.3,500/- along with the medical allowance Rs.500/- is provided. So far, Financial Assistance for 1134 persons have been sanctioned.

15.2 Financial Assistance to the Legal heirs of Aged Tamil Scholars

After the demise of the beneficiary, the Financial assistance is extended to their legal heirs till their lifetime. Monthly financial assistance of Rs. 2,500/- along with the medical allowance Rs.500/- is provided to his/her legal heir.

15.3 Financial assistance to Tamil scholars.

So far, Financial Assistance for 1104 Tamil scholars have been sanctioned.

15.4 Financial assistance to the Legal heirs of Tamil scholars.

Financial Assistance is being provided every month to the legal heirs (husband/wife) of Tamil scholars after their demise. Financial Assistance of Rs. 2500 per month with Medical allowance of Rs.500 is provided every month to the legal heirs. So far, Financial Assistance for 989 legal heirs of Tamil scholars have been sanctioned.

15.5 Financial Assistance for Border saviours

Also, permission is granted to the Tamil Scholars/ Border Saviours and their legal heirs to accompany a person with them during their free travel.

15.8 Financial assistance for Performing Obsequies (Funeral Rites) to the deceased Tamil Scholars/ Border Saviours

An amount of Rs.5000/- is granted to eligible Legal heir of the deceased Tamil Scholars/ Border saviours for performing obsequies. So far financial assistance has provided to 41 such families.

In order to promote such Tamil Organisations / Associations, financial assistance is being provided by Government of Tamilnadu for the construction of buildings and provided Tamil text books at free of cost for their children to learn Tamil.

DIRECTORATE OF TAMIL ETYMOLOGICAL DICTIONARY PROJECT

Following the footsteps of Perarignar Anna, ‘Muthamizh Arignar Kalaigarnar’ implemented many innovative projects for the development of the Tamil language and the addition of vocabulary on a daily basis. As such, it is the result of his attachment to mother tongue, the Tamil etymological dictionary project took a shape. As he was well aware of the importance of dictionary making, he mentioned that “another great work, Tamil Etymological Dictionary Project, which gets attention only during the period whenever our government is formed.”

What recompense the son can pay his father is the world's saying, what austere life his father must have lived to beget such a son.

4.5. Activities

Works on Research fields such as Literature, Grammar, Linguistics, Sociology, Culture, Folklore and Translation Domains and also Research works on Tamil Arts, Tamil Culture are being carried out for the growth of this Institute. Also, International Seminar, National Seminar, Conference and Workshops are being conducted and independent project works are also being undertaken by the faculty in this institute.

4.5.1 Research Supplementary Works

M.A. (Tamil) and Integrated 5 year Post-Graduate course in Tamil are being conducted in affiliation with the Tamil University. Tamil Literature course and One year Diploma course in Tamil Manuscripts (Suvadhiyiyal) and Publication through the Department of Manuscripts are being conducted. And one year Diploma course on Epigraphy and Archaeology in coordination with Thirukkural Art Gallery is also being conducted.

4.5.2. Computerised Language training laboratory

This Institute is engaged in the task of teaching Tamil language by the Department of Tamil language and linguistics, so as to make aware, the people of other states and other countries about the greatness of Tamil language by the way of computerized language training laboratory, established with the

financial assistance of the Government of Tamil Nadu. Classes are being conducted in two different sessions viz Introductory class of 3 months duration and a special level class of 6 months duration.

So far, about 620 people from overseas like America, France, Germany, Canada, South Africa, Sweden, China, Korea, Japan. Malaysia, Singapore and from other states of India have learned Tamil through this Institution. This year 2 Spaniards and 1 Frenchman are learning Tamil language.

4.5.3 Thirukkural Art Gallery

This gallery established at a cost of Rs.10.00 lakh with the financial assistance of Government of Tamil Nadu, displays rare photographs, paintings and texts relating to the time honoured 'Ulaga Pothumarai' Thirukkural and Thiruvalluvar. 133 paintings are placed on par with one painting per chapter. Students from Schools, Colleges and Universities, Foreigners and the Public, visit this exhibition every day. In addition to this, for the students to learn Thirukkural in their school age,

4.5.4. World Tamil Cultural Reception and Information Centre

World Tamil Cultural Reception and Information Centre has been set up with a cost of Rs.10.00 Lakh with the financial assistance of Government of Tamil Nadu. All information related to the Tamil Diaspora are being collected by communicating with the Tamil Diaspora scholars and maintained by this Centre.

International Conferences, Seminars, Special Discourses by Overseas Tamil scholars, and Workshops are being conducted by this Centre every year.

As such, the First World Tamil Music Conference was held at World Tamil Sangam, Madurai on the 14th and 15th December 2019 through this Centre. Various Tamil scholars and Tamil musicians from United States, Canada, Australia, Malaysia, Singapore and Sri Lanka participated in this

conference. More than 250 scholars presented their articles in the conference. This collection of articles has been published by the institute in 3 volumes entitled "World Tamil Music Studies".

4.5.5. Palm Leaf Manuscripts Preservation Centre

Palm Leaf Manuscripts Centre with modern infrastructure facility was established with the grant of Rs.34 lakh by Government of Tamil Nadu at the International Institute of Tamil Studies to preserve and maintain the Palm leaf Manuscripts that serve as the knowledge treasure of our ancestors on realising the importance of manuscripts and its preservation. More than thousands of Palm leaf Manuscript Bundles on Medicines, Grammar, Literature, Poetry, Astronomy (Kaalakanitham), Timeline imprints, Thanipadalgal, Thanikurippugal and more than hundreds of paper manuscripts are being collected and preserved in this Manuscripts Preservation Centre. Descriptive cataloguing of these manuscripts has been prepared.

This Preservation Centre, with the grant of Government of Tamil Nadu is undertaking the work of digitalization and preservation of unpreserved manuscripts found at Tamil Nadu and in other areas identified by field work.

4.5.6. Ancient Tamil Art Gallery

Ancient Tamil art Gallery has been created at the International Institute of Tamil Studies at a cost of Rs.346 lakh with the special fund of Government of Tamil Nadu to exhibit the cultural records of Ancient Tamils with diverse views in order to amaze the viewers, with the cultural records of the Ancient Tamil sculptures in stones, metal and wood models, embossed paintings and paintings.

This institution has produced 10 short films on topics such as the life Style of Ancient Tamils, Tamil Medicine, Water Management, War Strategies, Ancient Tamil's Regime Management, Ancient Tamil's weaving Technology, Ancient Tamil's Architecture, Ainthinai (5 types of land) Lifestyle,

Through this, Diploma classes, seminars and special lectures are being conducted.

4.5.10. Journal of Tamil Studies

The book titled “Tamizhial” quarterly bilingual (Tamil & English) - “The Journal of Tamil Studies (JOTS)” was published more than 111 issues over 50 yearRs. In this magazine encompassing research articles, books reviews and research articles by local and foreign Tamil scholars and introductions of institution publications. All Tamil journals published so far, have been uploaded on the institute’s website for the use of the public and researchers.

4.5.11 Research Library

The library, which started with about 100 books in 1970, is now functioning in the new building

The International Institute of Tamil Studies conducts full-time and part-time Ph.D. (Doctorate) programmes affiliated with the Tamil University, Thanjavur and University of Madras. So far, 239 scholars received Ph.D. degree and 375 students received M.Phil from this Institute. In the year 2021-22, 5 students are studying in doctorate degree and 13 students are studying in M.Phil degrees.

4.5.13. Postgraduate Programmes

The International Institute of Tamil Studies has started Masters Degree in Tamil from the year 2018 with the affiliation of Tamil University. In the year 2021-2022, 12 students are studying in the first year and 13 students in the second year.

Moreover, Diploma courses on 'Thirumandiram ' and 'Thiruvashagam' and Life sciences, Saiva Sidhantham (Semporutunivu) are conducted every year through Research Chairs. In 2021-22, 43 students in the Manuscriptology Printing Diploma Course, in 2022, 207 students in the Epigraphy and Archeology course, 120 students in the Thirumandiram and Life Sciences and 20 students are studying in Saiva Sidhantham Course.

CHAPTER -7

CENTRAL INSTITUTE OF CLASSICAL TAMIL, CHENNAI

The Central Institute of Classical Tamil (CICT) is an autonomous Institution established for the development of the Tamil language functioning under the Language Division of the Union Ministry of Education. The institute was established on October 12, 2004 after the Government of India declared Tamil as the Classical Language.

The Government of Tamil Nadu, allotted 16.58 Acres of Land at Perumbakkam, Chennai for the establishment of the Central Institute of Classical Tamil. The Central Government has sanctioned Rs.24,65,47,000/- (Rupees Twenty-Four Crore, Sixty-Five Lakh and Forty-Seven Thousand only) for the construction of a building at site in 2017. The work was completed and the new building was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and presided by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 12.1.2022.

The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu is the Chairman of this Institute. The functions of CICT has been governed by a Governing Committee, Finance Committee and an Academic Committee.

The Central Institute of Classical Tamil (CICT) concentrates exclusively on research works relating to the Classical phase of Tamil (from the early period to 600 A.D), which addresses the vital issues of the antiquity and uniqueness of Tamil. The CICT aims to document and preserve all components on ancient Tamil society.

The CICT aims to focus on the antiquity, uniqueness of Tamil language and literature, and the civilization and culture of the Tamils, with the following objectives.

- Encouraging and promoting research on the multifaceted nature of Indian culture and the contribution of Tamil components to Indian culture and heritage.
- Combining multidisciplinary scholars to study the antiquity of Tamil.
